



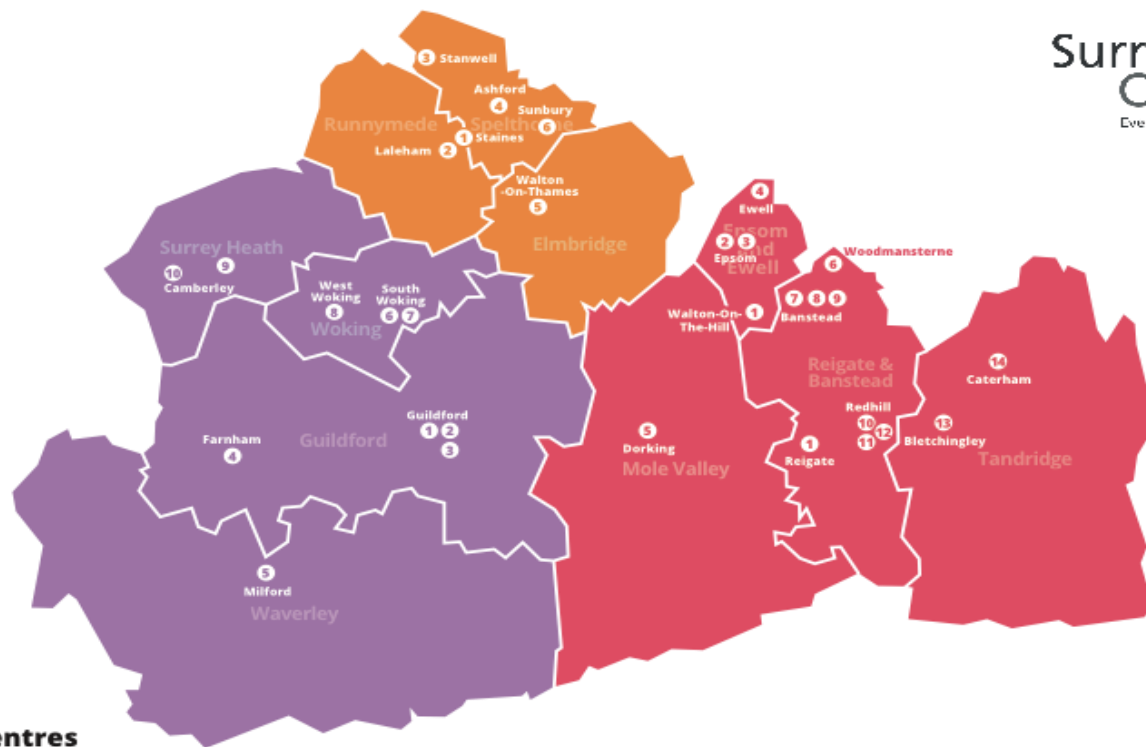

THE INCLUSION TRAFFIC LIGHTS HELP US THINK ABOUT THE PLACES PEOPLE GO AND THE PEOPLE THEY CONNECT WITH. Financial Pressures

- Day Service annual budget £12m
- £1.75m efficiency this year
- £1.75m further efficiency across 2022/23 and 23/24
- Need to fundamentally change what we do and how we do it



What does it mean in practice?

- Inclusion, not segregation – moving away from day service buildings that can't meet the test
- No one is left behind – people with complex needs have access to the right support
- A strengths-based approach – helping people to draw on their resources and networks with paid support for those that need it
- Whole person centred planning - how to support people with their ambitions, dreams and outcomes across our full portfolio
- Wider choice - a new mix of services, in-reach / out-reach, in the community and online
- An ordinary life – working, volunteering, learning, health and welfare, friends, connections
- Support close to home, travelling independently and less reliance on commissioned transport

Delivering Change

- **Property** - Fewer segregated buildings
- **Staffing** – More flexible support
- **Travel** – Increasing independent travel
- **Partnerships** – Libraries, Leisure and more
- **Quality and Choice** – Personalised support
